Pursuant to section 54 (1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 this Statement is made on behalf of Pallant Chambers and is our slavery and human trafficking statement.

We are committed to preventing acts of modern slavery and human trafficking from occurring with both our business and supply chain, and seek to partner with suppliers, contractors and business partners that uphold the same standard. We embrace a safe and diverse workplace where equal opportunity and fairness are of paramount importance.

How we operate

Pallant Chambers provide professional legal services generally within the UK and as consequence we have a small number of supply chains. The risks of modern slavery within the business are considered low.

As a legal business, Chambers works to professional standards and complies with all laws, regulations, and relevant rules. We ensure that all staff directly employed by Pallant Chambers do so at their own free-will and understand that they can cease their employment at any time under the terms of their employment contract. They are required to follow the Chambers policies and procedures. We abide by the Working Time Directive and staff can withdraw at any time.

We will be working with our current/new suppliers, contractors, and business partners to certify that they do not engage in slavery or human trafficking, or any activity associated with these offences. Suppliers will be asked to certify that each product complies with the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and any other law regarding slavery and human trafficking of the country/countries in which the materials are sourced.

Training

We will be raising internal awareness, by internal communications, to enable our key staff to understand the requirements of the Modern Slavery Act and enable them to identify potential issues.

This statement has been approved by the Pallant Chambers Management Committee who will review and update it regularly.
